## 2024 Report of the Capital Outlay & Transportation Subcommittee The Honorable Jeremy S. McPike, Chair February 18, 2024

Madam Chair and Members of the Committee:

The Capital Outlay and Transportation Subcommittee worked diligently to review the introduced budget as it relates to capital outlay and transportation.

As you will recall, the introduced budget proposed almost \$2.1 billion over the biennium in additional capital outlay spending with almost \$916.6 million in general fund cash, \$749.9 million in nongeneral fund cash, \$334.9 million in tax-supported debt, and \$133.6 million in revenue bond proceeds. The introduced budget set the course for using cash for capital outlay and underscores a shared commitment for a pay-as-you-go capital program when the state has readily available cash.

As we have experienced inflation in all areas of our budget, significant cost increases have occurred over previously budgeted project amounts. Inflation is expected to moderate, but these projects represent our commitments and still require funding for the construction. Therefore, we fully endorse the Governor's proposed additional \$250.0 million to supplement capital projects for inflationary cost increases.

The priority of the Commonwealth should always be focused on maintaining our existing capital assets. The Subcommittee ensures maintenance reserve is funded in both years of the biennium and that it is funded in cash. We increase maintenance reserve allocations by \$95.0 million for a reserve program totaling \$499.0 million.

As always, we maintain our long-standing practice of strong fiscal management and resisted the urge to issue more debt even if it is available

in our Debt Capacity Model. The Subcommittee's recommendations reduce tax-supported bond authorizations by \$89.5 million.

In addition, we align capital funding to the Committee's planned transfers from the Revenue Reserve Fund. Even though we can transfer these funds due to exceeding the limit on the combined reserve funds balance, we prudently directed these one-time funds to one-time capital projects that are currently in planning.

Our recommended amendments increase overall general fund cash in capital outlay by \$580.1 million as compared to the introduced budget.

- We fully fund a new state office building as it had been previously legislatively authorized and consequently defer long term leases for Capitol Square agencies.
- We authorize full construction for Norfolk State's Fine Arts Building, Virginia State's urban agriculture center and critical waterproofing projects, and Christopher Newport's modern plant operations building.
- We recommend inclusion of seven education projects for detail planning and five education projects for pre-planning.

In the area of transportation, the Subcommittee continues the prudent fiscal practice of limiting general fund support or only providing general fund support when one-time funding is available. We discussed high priority needs across the state, including I-81 safety, toll relief, and the Northern Virginia transportation network.

We recommend continuing the conversations around the financing of the Washington Metropolitan Transportation Authority in accordance with post-pandemic commuting patterns. The Subcommittee recommends enhanced reporting and consultation requirements while temporarily lifting the cap on the allowed budget growth for the Metro system.

This completes the report of the Subcommittee on Capital Outlay and Transportation, and I would like to conclude by expressing my appreciation to the members of the Subcommittee for their diligent efforts in shaping these recommendations.
