Summary of Tax Relief

- Working Virginians Tax Rebate. Provides a tax rebate of \$200 for single filers and \$400 for joint filers up to their tax liability by October 15th (\$977.8 million).
- Extends Expiring Standard Deduction, Earned Income Tax Credit, Pass-Through Entity Tax. Extends these expiring tax provisions tied to the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act expiration date of December 31, 2025, to December 31, 2027.
- Increases Standard Deduction. Increases the standard deduction to \$8,750 for single filers and \$17,500 for joint filers, a respective increase of \$250 for single filers and \$500 for joint filers for tax year 2025 and 2026.
- **Refundable Earned Income Tax Credit.** Increases the refundability of the state earned income tax credit from 15.0 to 20.0 percent of the federal credit.
- **Thresholds for Estimated Tax Payments.** Increases the liability threshold for estimated payments from \$150 to \$1,000.

Other Tax Policy/Enactments Language

- Housing Opportunity Tax Credit. Extends the Housing Opportunity Tax Credit from tax year 2025 to 2030 and increases the annual cap from \$60.0 to \$64.0 million per calendar year.
- **Sunset Extensions.** Extends the sunset on the sales tax exemption for drilling equipment and bullion until July 1, 2026, and extends the Recyclable Materials Processing Equipment Tax Credit until January 1, 2027.
- **Pari-Mutuel Wagering Referendum.** Requires that the Virginia Racing Commission not authorize a licensee to construct, establish, operate, or own a satellite facility until a referendum approving the question is held on or after July 1, 2025, if such locality has not passed a referendum allowing parimutuel wagering on or after July 1, 2018, and no pari-mutuel wagering at satellite facilities was authorized by the Commission on or before January 1, 2025.
- **Pari-Mutuel Wagering Distributions.** Allocates all local pari-mutuel local tax generated to locality with a satellite facility beginning July 1, 2026, and applies a significant infrastructure facility limited license tax upon any significant infrastructure limited licensee of \$110,000 for each race day beginning July 1, 2026.
- Workers Compensation. Increases from 52 weeks to 104 weeks the maximum duration after the date of diagnosis that workers' compensation benefits are payable for anxiety disorder, depressive disorder, and post-traumatic stress disorder incurred by law-enforcement officers and firefighters acting in the line of duty.

Summary of Major New Operating Spending Items

- \$222.9 million GF to raise the support cap to the prevailing ratio of 27.89 positions per 1,000 students.
- \$134.4 million GF for a \$1,000 bonus in the current fiscal year for teachers and school support staff that requires no local match (in addition to the planned salary increase of 3.0 percent for FY 2026 in Chapter 2).
- \$83.1 million for a 1.5 percent bonus for state and state-supported local employees (in addition to the planned salary increase of 3.0 percent for FY 2026 in Chapter 2).
- \$52.8 million GF to provide a special education add-on.
- \$55.0 million GF in the first year for operational support to help offset inflationary costs (there is also \$20.0 million in the first year for additional support for HBCU partnerships).
- \$50.0 million GF the first year for disaster mitigation efforts in qualified communities.
- \$50.0 million GF the first year for community-scale flood protection and resiliency efforts.
- \$25.0 million GF to support an employer cost-share pilot program to provide additional early childhood education slots.
- \$25.0 million GF the first year for grants to support critical drinking water infrastructure projects.
- \$20.0 million GF the first year for a rental assistance pilot program to encourage housing stability in Planning Districts 8 and 23.
- \$15.0 million the first year from balances to support training for industry-based credentials in high demand occupations.
- \$15.0 million GF the first year for need-based undergraduate aid.

Overview of Public Education in HB 1600

- HB 1600 includes a net increase of \$520.1 million GF and \$262.3 million NGF across the biennium. Major investments include:
 - \$222.9 million GF the second year to raise the support cap to the current prevailing ratio;
 - \$134.4 million GF the first year to provide a \$1,000 bonus for teachers and instructional positions;
 - \$52.8 million GF the second year to support a special education add-on;
 - \$25.0 million GF the first year for an early childhood care and education employer cost-share pilot program; and
 - \$12.0 million GF across the biennium to support a mathematics initiative, including grants for school divisions.

Select Language Amendments – Public Education

- **Teacher Bonus:** Language specifies that the bonus shall not require a local match.
- **Mathematics Initiative:** Supports the improvement of mathematics in public schools, including the establishment of Mathematics Advisory Task Forces to provide recommendations for improvement to mathematics education and grant funds for mathematics improvement initiatives.
- **Assessment:** Directs the Department and Secretary of Education to contract with a vendor to support the development of an RFP for a new state assessment system.

• Early Childhood Education:

- Provides language directing the establishment of the Employer Cost-Share Pilot Program in collaboration with the Virginia Early Childhood Foundation.
- Limits participation in the program to families with household incomes at or below 85.0 percent of the state median income, and establishes reasonable copayments based on income level.
- Caps family copayments at 5.0 percent of household income for other early childhood education programs.

Higher Education and Other Education



Overview of Higher Education in HB 1600

- Provides \$55.0 million GF the first year to maintain affordability and access goals at public colleges and universities and minimize increases in tuition.
- Includes \$20.0 million GF the first year for the ongoing Historically Black Colleges and Universities collaboration that includes Norfolk State University, Virginia State University, Hampton University, and Virginia Union University and localities.
- Provides \$26.8 million GF for increased student financial assistance, including:
 - \$15.0 million the first year for in-state undergraduate financial aid at public colleges and universities.
 - \$10.0 million for the Virginia Tuition Assistance Grant (VTAG) to maintain the \$5,250 award level.
 - \$1.8 million the first year for a VTAG supplemental award of up to \$2,000 at federally designated Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSI).
 - Also includes \$15.0 million in balances the first year to support the workforce credential grant that provides industry-based credential training.
- Contains \$120.0 million to support offsetting the cost of tuition waiver programs.
 - Includes \$100.0 million GF and \$20.0 million dedicated from the FY 2025 year-end surplus. Makes no changes to
 program eligibility.

Overview of Health and Human Resources in HB 1600

- Conference Report for HB 1600 includes a net increase of \$11.1 million GF over the biennium, bringing biennial total investment in HHR to \$867.0 million GF. Major GF spending amendments include:
 - \$25.0 million GF for drinking water infrastructure grants;
 - \$10.0 million GF for an increase in rates for nursing homes;
 - \$8.7 million GF for care coordination at community services boards;
 - \$6.9 million GF for expanded coverage of weight loss drugs under Medicaid; and
 - \$4.8 million GF to fund the expansion of co-response programs.

- Suspending the performance withholds for Medicaid managed care for one year;
- Limiting funding for provider rates studies to those authorized by the General Assembly;
- Requiring performance measures for provider supplemental payments; and
- Directing DMAS to improve the eligibility process to enroll pregnant women more quickly.

 - Contingent reserve from FY 2025 surplus revenue of \$20.0 million for VMSDEP and remaining surplus reserved to respond to federal funding reductions;
 - Part 4 enactment to increase the number of weeks of covered treatment for anxiety, depressive, and PTSD disorders from 52 to 104 weeks under worker's compensation;
 - Legislative Workgroups for use of surplus 529 funds and Legislative Agency IT Oversight;
 - Oversight Council for the State Health Plans;
 - Removal of new lines of credit added in the introduced bill;
 - Creation of processes to review and respond to federal changes impacting state revenues or federal revenue;
 - Compensation Board studies related to the jail virtual hearings and constitutional officer salaries.

- \$626.0 million GF for 10 higher education projects in a pool;
- \$106.6 million GF for 8 state agency projects in a pool;
- \$71.2 million tax-supported debt to support local stormwater projects and wastewater treatment upgrades;
- \$62.4 million GF to supplement previously authorized capital projects;
- \$42.0 million GF for improvement, deferred maintenance, life-safety projects at higher education institutions;
- \$32.7 million GF to support detailed planning of 10 projects and 3 preplanning studies;
- \$32.3 million GF to improve HVAC at Catawba Hospital and safety and security improvement at Southwestern Virginia Mental Health Institute;
- \$25.0 million GF for HVAC at state correctional facilities;
- \$20.0 million GF for state park deferred maintenance;
- \$14.5 million GF for fixtures, furnishings, and equipment for projects nearing completion; and
- \$10.9 million GF to fully plan the State Police Training Academy replacement project.
